Forscher, die sich für Kampfstress, Vorbereitung auf das Gefecht, öffentliche Meinung zum Krieg, Karriereentwicklung und Entscheidungsfindung im Zusammenhang mit dem Militär interessieren, können dort wesentliches Forschungsmaterial ausfindig machen.
